Governor Malloy's Environmental Accomplishments: In Detail

Protecting Long Island Sound

- Took a consistent leadership position in recognizing and protecting Long Island Sound as one of Connecticut's most beautiful and iconic natural resources; from substantially upgrading Stamford's water treatment facilities to helping defeat the Broadwater liquid natural gas facility.

Energy

- Made Stamford one of the first cities in the Northeast to establish an Energy Engineer Utility Manager solely responsible for improving energy efficiency. Instituted **Sustainable Stamford**, the mayor's task force on sustainability, comprised of members from Stamford's business, educational, environmental, and religious communities; City staff; and concerned citizens.
- Partnered with the Connecticut Energy Efficiency Fund and CL&P to connect Stamford residents to cost-saving energy conservation measures, taking advantage of renewable energy opportunities available through the Clean Energy Fund. As a result, the City of Stamford was awarded as the **Municipal Leader for Energy Efficiency**, the first municipality to be recognized by the Northeast Energy Efficiency Partnership.
- Resulting from more than 80 projects initiated during his tenure as mayor (1995-2009), saved \$4 million in energy costs and 14.7 million kilowatt hours, nearly 20% of the city's municipal building usage in the Stamford Government Center, schools, city garages, traffic signals, museums, police headquarters and parks.
- Championed the legislation to establish the Connecticut Green Bank (Clean Energy Finance and Investment Authority) to better leverage Clean Energy Fund resources, attract private capital and maximize the state's investment in energy innovation and efficiency.

Transit

- Pursued transit-oriented development for an active and pedestrian-friendly environment in the City's core business center; expanding the walkable and lively historic center; building new residential neighborhoods near Stamford's branch line train stations, and promoting the rehabilitation and redevelopment of Stamford's South End neighborhood.
- Governor Malloy continues to be very supportive infrastructure investments that promote public transit and commuter alternatives to highway driving. He has paved the way for Hartford area bus rapid transit, increased investment in new rail cars for Metro-North commuters and actively sought federal funding for high speed rail from New Haven – Hartford –Springfield (successfully securing \$30 million).

Education

- Established an environmental inter-district magnet school to serve students from K-8th grades, designed to meet LEED silver certification. The design includes a green roof, solar photovoltaic panels, a wind turbine for power development and water saving.
- Since the late 1990s, then-Mayor and now Governor Malloy continues to be a catalyst for SoundWaters expanding its education programs from Schooner and school-based programs to include extensive land-based education at the SoundWaters Coastal Education Center at Cove Island Park. With the inspiration and support of Governor Malloy, SoundWaters now reaches over 25,000 students annually, with greater than 8,000 of those students representing underserved communities.
